### Kettle Falls

Dreamswept Farm is located in the heart of woodland territory on Jackknife Mountain, atop the historically rich town of Kettle Falls, long ago named Noisy Waters by the Native American Indians. Revered for more than 1,000 years as a sacred gathering place for no less than 14 different First Nations peoples, this area is undoubtedly the crowned jewel of Northeastern Washington and the best-kept secret of the Pacific Northwest.

### Little Gallea Restaurant

345 W 3rd Ave

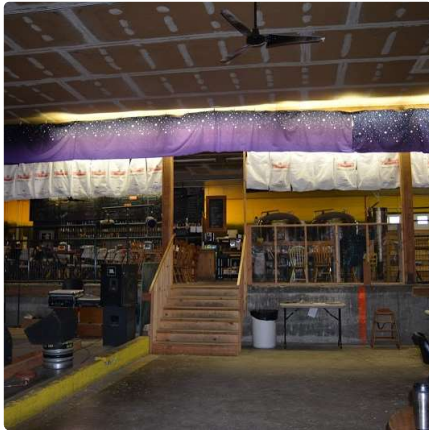

This little spot is a local favorite and a well-kept secret to be sure. There is also a lunch menu here with all kinds of hearty mountain favorites. FYI: they close at 1 PM and after 11 AM, there is only a limited breakfast menu (think no syrup-sad face) so get there early, folks!



## Backyard BBQ

125 E 3rd Ave

When they say BBQ, they aren't lying! This place is beyond amazing if you're looking for that sweet, smoky flavor. Practically everything they serve here has a BBQ spin to it, from nachos to burgers, and they smoke it all right there in-house. You'll also find it to be a favorite among the crowd of folks who ride up and down these beautiful mountain highways and you'll see that shiny chrome lined up all down the block for this grub.



## Northern Ales Inc

If you're looking for a place that combines good food with the feel of secret hideaway, look no further than this little spot. This is a local watering hole crafting its own brews using locally sourced ingredients and mountain charm. Locals hang around here for all kinds of fun. There oft may be peanuts on the floor or live music playing and if you look real hard, you may see a guy with hay sticking out of his overalls kicking back in the corner while he drinks a Huckleberry brew and eats an entire large pizza (made in one of them good old wood fire brick ovens) without any help from his wife...and if you stare long enough you'll probably catch a raised eyebrow over the top of the Sasquatch Newsletter-if which happens, BTW, you'd be best advised to quickly look away.



## Miss B's Haven

250 East 3rd Avenue

This little drive-through coffee stop is wonderful. There are enough drinks available to make one feel the power of choices but not so many as to overwhelm a person. Each coffee drink can be ordered hot or cold and there are other caffeinated delights like Red Bull smoothies. Prices are also quite low for coffee in this day and age, and for those who are trying to isolate during the pandemic, you can't beat drive-through.

## Sightseeing



### **Kettle Falls Historical Center**

The Kettle Falls Historical Center is a community based nonprofit organization which preserves and interprets the heritage and cultures of the diverse peoples of the Kettle Falls. These historical art exhibits span over a prehistory focus all the way up to the creation of Lake Roosevelt. The Historical Center has existed to serve our community residents and visitors through educational programs and exhibits, and the nurturing of cultural activities which reflect the mission of their focus.



### **Davis Lake Campground**

This area is a very short drive up Jackknife Mountain from where we are located. There is a lovely lake there with fantastic Cutthroat Trout Fishing and boating is allowed with non-combustion engines.
